State Structure

In Colorado, delinquency services are organized at both the state and local level. Probation services are overseen by the Division of Probation Services within the Office of the State Court Administrator and are administered by probation officers in 22 judicial districts. The Division of Youth Corrections within the Colorado Department of Human Services, Office of Children Youth, and Families administers aftercare services (often referred to as parole in Colorado), commitment to public state facilities, and secure detention services.

Colorado follows the federal definition of a status offense, calling status offense behavior or conduct which would not be a crime if committed by an adult in the jurisdiction in which the offense was committed.
