In North Carolina, for a juvenile between 6 and 16, being unlawfully absent from school, regularly disobedient to and beyond the disciplinary control of the juvenile's parent, guardian, or custodian, being regularly found in places where it is unlawful for a juvenile to be or running away from home for a period of more than 24 hours are status offense behaviors. For a juvenile who is 16 or 17 years of age, being regularly disobedient to and beyond the disciplinary control of the juvenile's parent, guardian, or custodian, being regularly found in places where it is unlawful for a juvenile to be or running away from home for a period of more than 24 hours are status offense behaviors. Status offense cases are classified as undisciplined juveniles. The district court has jurisdiction over status offenders and delinquents.
